The Initiative to Protect Jekyll Island State Park

The Initiative to Protect Jekyll Island State Park (IPJI) was founded in 2006 as a means of sampling public opinion on Jekyll Island's redevelopment and of allowing the State Park's many friends to work together to help shape its future.

An all-volunteer, non-profit association with a modest beginning, IPJI has grown to over 10,000 supporters committed to the preservation of Jekyll's uniqueness and the maintenance of Georgia's barrier island State Park as an affordable and family-friendly vacation site.



IPJI's Imperatives

Uphold the 1971 law requiring that 65 percent of the land area of Jekyll Island remains in its natural condition.

Create a comprehensive Conservation Plan to manage Jekyll's natural resources and protect its environmentally sensitive areas.

Redevelop Jekyll's aging oceanfront accommodations, staying within existing footprints and honoring the State Park's affordability mandate.

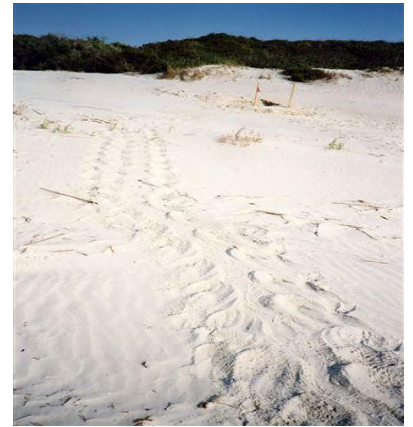
Ensure that there are ample opportunities for public involvement in planning for Jekyll Island's future.

Prohibit further development of Jekyll's beachfront. Keep the remaining open beach open!
